## The MAX Provides Youth the Opportunity to Learn from Nationally Acclaimed Artists

High School Juniors and Seniors Are Invited to Submit Applications Now

MERIDIAN, Miss. (March 24, 2023) – High school juniors and incoming seniors from a sixcounty area are invited to participate in intensive music, dance, and writing workshops this summer at the Mississippi Arts + Entertainment Experience. The MAX Success programs, Sound of Success, Dance for Success, and Write for Success, are designed for incoming juniors and seniors entering the 2023/2024 school year from Lauderdale, Kemper, Neshoba, Newton, Jasper, and Clarke Counties. The immersive workshops allow students to explore and hone their preferred craft while learning from industry experts in writing, dance, and music. The MAX is accepting online applications now until April 30, 2023, for the workshops that will take place in June and July.

Students create works of art both in groups and individually. Sounds of Success students receive coaching from accomplished songwriters and get the chance to write and record music in The MAX's state-of-the-art Governor's Recording Studio. Dance for Success students work in groups with industry professionals to develop an interpretive dance routine representing the artist's journey to success. Write for Success students workshop with experienced authors to create characters, settings, and storylines. The students are introduced to various colleges and career paths available to them locally and take inspiring field trips to other museums and studios. At the close of each program, students participate in a commencement ceremony and showcase their art form within the museum.

Featured speakers and workshop facilitators include Adam Box, songwriter and drummer for the Grammy-winning country band Brothers Osborne; W. Ralph Eubanks, award-winning author of *A Place Like Mississippi: A Journey Through a Real and Imagined Literary Landscape*; Kiese Laymon, award-winning author of *Heavy: An American Memoir* and *Long Division*; Beth Ann Fennelly, former Mississippi Poet Laureate and author of *Heating & Cooling: 52 Micro-Memoirs*; Erret James, also known as E. Jae, owner and artistic director of X-Finity Dance Academy; Rebekah Pleasant-Patterson, Executive Director of Griot Arts Inc., among others.
